

The *Scientific Journal Heritage For Future* publishes scientific articles presenting the results of original empirical, theoretical, technical or analytical research, including case studies. The papers present the current state of knowledge, research methodology, the course of the research process, its results and conclusions, with references to the cited literature (bibliography).

Sending an article for publication is tantamount to a statement that it was not published or submitted for publication in another journal and that it does not infringe on the copyrights of other persons and entities.

Language: Articles are published in English. It is essential that article is submitted in grammatically correct English. If you are not a native English speaker, we recommend that you have your manuscript professionally edited before submission or read by a native English-speaking colleague.

The title page should contain:

- title of the article,
- names and surnames of the authors,
- full affiliations (with addresses) and e-mail addresses of all authors,
- ORCID numbers of the authors (if they have one),
- name and surname of the corresponding author,
- keywords (from 3 to 5),
- abstract (up to 250 words).

Text: Text written in Microsoft Word, Bookman Old Style font, size 12 p., single spacing, all margins 2.5 cm. It is allowed to use italics and bolds without applying underlining. Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Preferred volume of the article: from 20,000 to 30,000 characters with spaces.

Figures and Tables: Please ensure the figures and tables are placed next to the relevant text in the manuscript. Tables must be editable. The corresponding caption should be placed directly below the figure or table. References to figures and tables in the text should be given in the form: Fig. 1, Tab. 1. Figures should be placed in the resolution of at least 300 DPI.

Acknowledgements: The obligatory section, it should appear immediately after the summary/conclusions of the article. All sources of funding of the study should be disclosed.

Author Contributions: The section is obligatory for articles with several authors, it should appear immediately after the Acknowledgments section. A short paragraph specifying authors individual contributions must be provided.

Footnotes: Footnotes should be numbered continuously for the entire article, including bibliographic items, Bookman Old Style 10 p.

Bibliography: At the end of the article, a Bibliography should be placed. The rules adopted in the APA international bibliographic style should be applied (<http://library.williams.edu/citing/styles/apa.php>). We recommend preparing the references with a bibliography software package, such as, e.g., EndNote to avoid typing mistakes and duplicated references.

References should be cited parenthetically in the text by author surname(s) and year, some examples are given below:

- 1 author – (Smith, 2017)
- 2 authors – (Smith, & Jones, 2014)
- 3 authors – (Smith, Jones 2, & Mendez, 2015)
- 4 or more authors – (Smith et al., 2016)

In the Bibliography section references should be ordered alphabetically by the first author's surname, some examples are given below:
